## WEEK IN REVIEW

### Domestic Economy

The GDP grew by 3.7 per cent in real terms in second quarter 2018, mainly due to the moderate expansion of Agriculture sector and service sector. However industry sector contracted in second quarter 2018.

The total outstanding market liquidity decreased to a deficit of Rs. 162.584 bn by end of the 07 December 2018, compared to a deficit of Rs. 135.967 bn by the end of 30 November 2018.

All Share Price Index (ASPI) increased by 0.83% to 6,069.2 points and the S&P SL 20 Index increased by 0.49% to 3,194.0 points, compared to the previous week.

NCPI decreased to 0.1 % in October 2018.

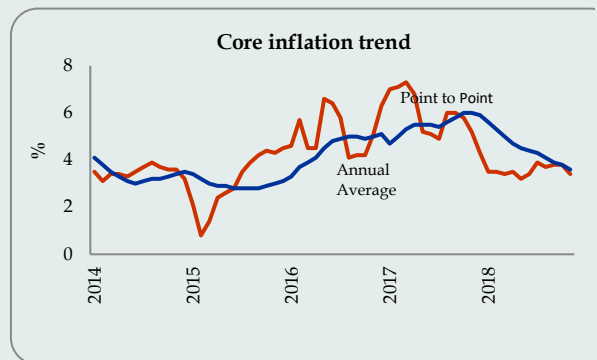
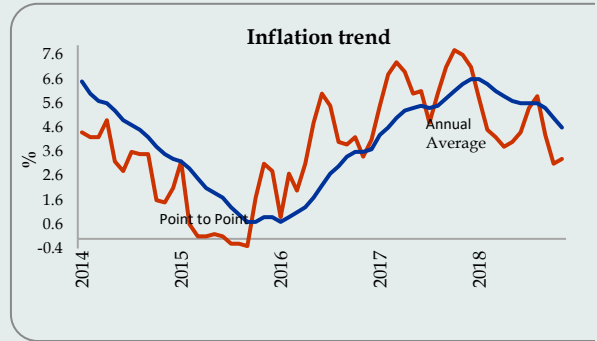
Global growth is projected to stabilize at 3.2 percent in both 2018 and 2019.

The point to point inflation of CCPI increased to 3.3 per cent in November 2018. The annual average of CCPI is 4.6 per cent in November 2018. Core inflation that measures the price movements of the items in the CCPI basket excluding fresh food, energy, transport, rice and coconut, decreased to 3.4 per cent, on point to point basis, while annual average core inflation decreased to 3.6 per cent, in November 2018. The National Consumer Price Index (NCPI) covering price movements in all provinces of the country decreased to 0.1 percent in October 2018, on year on year basis.

- Export earnings during January to September 2018 increased by 5.6 percent mainly due to the expansion of earnings from industry exports. The Industrial export earnings for the month of September 2018 increased by 9.4 percent, compared to the respective period of 2017.
- On a cumulative basis, expenditure on imports increased by 10.4 percent for the period during January to September 2018. Expenditure on imports for the month of September 2018 increased by 6.1 percent reflecting the performance of imports of intermediate goods and consumer goods.
- Trade deficit increased to US\$ 713.2 Mn in September 2018 over the same period of 2017.

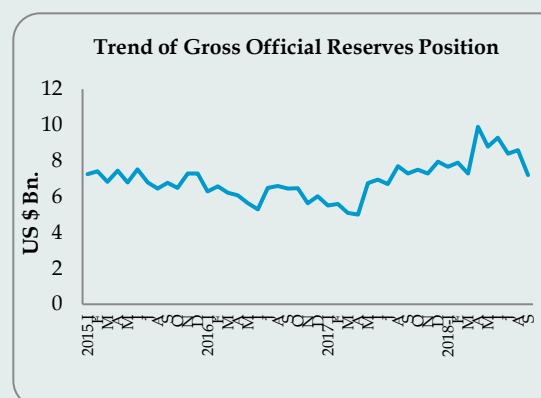
### Tourism

### Official reserves

The total reserves and gross official reserves were US\$ 11.0 Bn and US\$ 8.6 Bn, respectively by end August 2018. Total foreign reserves were sufficient to 5.1 months of imports and the gross official reserves were equivalent to 3.8 months of imports in September 2018. Workers' remittances decreased by 1.5 per cent in dollar terms to US \$ 498.2 Mn. in September 2018.

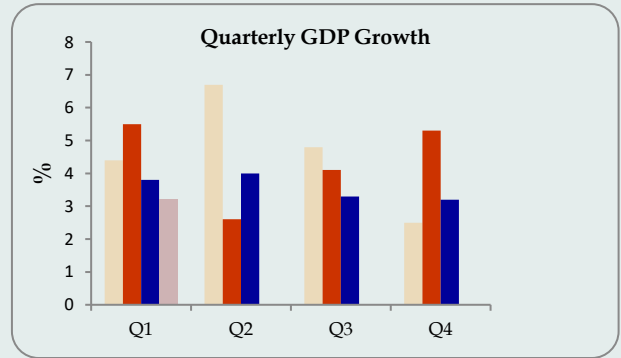
